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Flu vaccinations

The Immunisation Service are coming into school on **Friday 25/10/2024** to offer your child the nasal Flu spray vaccination.

Please complete a consent form for your child to say YES or NO for them to have these vaccines.

This must be completed by a Parent or Legal Guardian with Parental Responsibility

Follow the steps below, **before the closing date and time**, which is at 11am, 3 working days before the school session date above. If you miss the cut off time, the consent form will reopen one working day after the session, enabling you to submit a form for your child to be offered the vaccination within one of our catch-up clinics.

If we have not received a completed consent form from you and your child presents themselves to the Immunisation Team during the school session to request vaccination, we may offer them the opportunity to consent for themselves. (Details in the FAQs).

Please note that if we do not receive either a YES or NO consent form, the immunisation team may contact you by email, phone or text to ask for your consent preference.

Lockers

If any students would like to be allocated a locker for this academic year, they will need to complete the below form to request a locker and provide their own combination padlock. Once the form is completed, reception will allocate locker numbers and students will be advised via tutor time when their locker is available.

Forgotten items

If your child has forgotten an item/equipment and asks you to bring this in during the school day, please note that your child will need to come to reception to collect this. Our reception staff will not be able to personally deliver items to classrooms. Please have a conversation with your child about this so that they are aware.

Lost property

Alternatively, you are welcome to access this between 8am - 4pm Monday-Friday. Lost property must be claimed before the end of each half term. Remaining items will be donated or disposed of.

There are days when all of us struggle with how we are feeling. Things can get tough, and it can be difficult to know how to cope. For many young people, when this happens, they don't always get the help they need when they need it. They don't know where to turn, who to talk to, or even if anyone else feels the same. No young person should feel alone with their mental health. Together, we can change this. Students can take part by wearing a hint of yellow to school. Bohunt Horsham Library

Bohunt Horsham Library has a selection of books categorised as Young Adult. They are books that have been written for teenagers for Year 9 and above. These books may contain more mature themes, such as threats, violence, sexual references, strong language, discrimination, drugs, supernatural, horror, or imitable behaviour. Usually, the protagonist is a teenager, generally aged 14+, so it may include teenage romance, family break-ups, life choices etc from the point of view of the adolescent. They are labelled as YA (Young Adult)

We also have some graphic novels that have been age-rated (T+), such as the popular Marvel/DC comics. We do not let students in Years 7 and 8 borrow T+ and YA books because of the content; however some students do request to read them.
